Dr. Harrold is the Medical Director and CMO/Vice President of Medical Services of Hospice and Community Care in Lancaster and York, PA. She has more than two decades of experience in hospice and palliative care. Prior to becoming certified in Hospice and Palliative Medicine, she received her medical degree from the Medical College of Virginia; completed an internal medicine residency at Bowman Grey; and completed a Master of Public Health degree with special emphasis in epidemiology and biostatistics at The George Washington University.

Dr. Harrold serves on the Board of Directors of NHPCO and previously served as a director on the boards of the Hospice and Palliative Nurses Foundation, the American Academy of Hospice and Palliative Medicine (AAHPM), the American Board of Hospice and Palliative Medicine (ABHPM), and the Pennsylvania Hospice Network. Dr. Harrold is the chair of the Professional Education Committee and serves on its various subcommittees. Her service to NHPCO has also included the

Palliative Care Advisory Council, Relatedness Workgroup, Physician Education Subcommittee, the NHPCO/MAC Workgroup, Governance Committee, CMO Council, and the Physician Section of the National Council of Hospice and Palliative Professionals. Additionally, Dr. Harrold serves on the inaugural Exam Committee of the Hospice Medical Director Certification Board; she formerly served on the American Board of Internal Medicine Examination Committee for Hospice and Palliative Medicine and the Examination Committee for the American Board of Hospice and Palliative Medicine.

She also serves as faculty for the UIHC Hospice and Palliative Medicine fellowship program. She creates and teaches palliative care content across the PharmD curriculum, in addition to co-teaching in the University of Iowa India Winterim course with Pallium India. Her research interests include pharmacopalliation, opioid safety, and evaluation of instructional methods.

Dr. Lockman earned a Bachelor of Science in biology at the College of Charleston and a Doctor of Pharmacy from the University of Maryland. After finishing a PGY-1 Pharmacy Practice residency at the University of Maryland Medical Center, she completed a PGY-2 pharmacy residency in Pain Management and Palliative Care and a fellowship in instructional design at the University of Maryland School of Pharmacy. As part of this program, she earned a Masters of Arts in Instructional Systems Development from University of Maryland Baltimore County in May 2016.
