In adopting these performance-driven incentives, Medicare and other payers have placed significant weight on improving patient transitions from hospital to post-acute and ambulatory care. This webinar will identify hospital care transitions interventions that will benefit patients and yield financial rewards for hospitals, post-acute, and ambulatory care providers and practitioners.
