## Senate Aims to Pass Major Opioids Package after Labor Day

Majority Leader Mitch McConnell told reporters that the Senate's latest bipartisan bill to address the opioid crisis will be a top priority after Labor Day, giving HELP Chairman Lamar Alexander (R-Tenn.) more time to negotiate the giant legislative package.

McConnell is expected to secure passage under unanimous consent, without an open amendments process. After the midterm election, the package will be combined with a similar legislative package in the House, passed in June.

Based on the most recent draft available, the legislation will combine at least 10 bills from four Senate committees. The entire package will cost at least \$11 billion over five years, according to CBO scores of the original bills.


