Overview:

Impaired circulation and bony deformities make lower extremity wounds difficult to heal and recommended interventions are often rejected. This webinar evaluates treatment of arterial, pressure-related, edema-related and neuropathic wounds of the lower leg, ankle and foot and provides an updated look at products and treatments that help with healing.

Learning Objectives:

- Summarize four key assessment points for lower extremity wounds.
- Examine three methods for decreasing bacterial load in high-risk wounds.
- Analyze optimal dressing choices based on wound depth and exudate amount.
