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Introduction

A Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner (SANE) is a Registered Nurse who has been specially trained to provide trauma-informed medical care to sexual assault victims, including forensic collection of evidence.

Program Mission: Coordinate the resources and provide support for healthcare professionals across the state in order to:

- Provide immediate, compassionate, culturally sensitive, and comprehensive forensic evaluation and treatment by trained, professional medical experts.
- Maximize the probability of collecting and preserving the physical evidence of an assault for potential use in the legal system.
- Avoid further trauma to all sexual assault survivors in the health care environment.

Clinical Skills Training

Our bi-annual Clinical Skills Labs (CSL) are designed to provide clinical practice to medical professionals who are new to sexual assault medical forensic examinations. Rural participants receive travel reimbursements including hotel stay.

Curriculum includes:

- ✓ Obtaining medical history
- ✓ Legal consideration
- ✓ Evidence collection
- ✓ Forensic photography
- ✓ Developing a plan of care
- ✓ Discharge/safety planning
- ✓ CDC's STI treatment
- ✓ Case scenarios
- ✓ Performing a minimum of 4 pelvic exams on live models

Technical Assistance (TA)

Acute TA

24/7 technical assistance will be available by phone for all medical facilities in the state when caring or patients who report sexual violence. The phone lines will be covered by experienced medical forensic examiners who will answer questions regarding various topics on the care of this patient population.

Non-Acute TA

Non-acute TA is now being provided through site visits from our SANE-Certified partners at Avera Health and Sanford Health. The two main goals of these site visits:

- 1. Better understand the challenges faced by rural healthcare facilities.
- 2. Provide hospitals with tips on processes, protocols, and trainings.

University Curriculum

Efforts are in place to have forensic nursing curriculum embedded into academic nursing programs. This has been successfully implemented with USD's Nursing Program (BSN and RN-BSN).

The goal is to expand these efforts by partnering with one additional nursing program in the state by the end of the grant period.
