<p>SD Definition of Palliative Care</p>	<p><i>Palliative care is medical care for people living with a serious illness. This type of care is focused on providing relief from the symptoms and stress of illness with the goal to improve quality of life for both the patient and family. Effective palliative care is delivered by a trained team of doctors, nurses, social workers, chaplains, and other health professionals who collaborate to provide an extra layer of support. Based on the needs of the patient, not on prognosis, palliative care is appropriate at any age and any stage of serious illness and may be provided alongside curative treatments in primary and specialty settings.</i></p>

<p>Legislative News- Place holder- please share information you want to be sure our group needs to know-</p>	<p>House Passes Advancing Telehealth Beyond COVID-19 ACT (bill 4040): extends telehealth flexibilities through 2024- goes to senate. This includes “evaluation and management” and behavioral health audio-only technology. We didn't discuss this, but do we need to do anything to support this? Rapid City uses primarily phone contact with their outpatient palliative care team, especially to the reservation areas.</p> <p>Hospice Final Rule came out July 2, 2022: 3.8% increase instead of proposed 2.7%. The Final FY2023 Routine Home Care (days 1-60) rate will increase from \$203.40 to \$211.34. The Final FY2023 Routine Home Care (day 61+) rate will increase from \$160.74 to \$167.00</p> <p>Coalition to Transform Advanced Care-(CTAC) https://thectac.org/about/ is working with congress on a bill that would: eliminate Medicare co-pay for ACP, require education for PCP on ACP and billing and allow LCSW to bill for ACP- trying to get a republican sponsor. Michele will share more information as it becomes available</p>

<p>Pediatric Crisis Standards of Care</p>	<p>Tammy Hatting- Will plan to follow the same process as the Adult Standards of Crisis Care with 3 work group: the medical group; the legal/ethics group and the education group. Discussion on members for each group. Shelly Roy is going to look for a pediatric NP from Monument; Recommendation of State Bar. Cameo will check with a law student to help with research, Sanford has a pediatric palliative care social worker who is also an ethicist who will join, Pediatric Critical care docs across the systems to be represented. Groups just being formed and more info to come as the process moves forward.</p>
