SD Definition of	Palliative care is medical care for people living with a serious illness. This type of
Palliative Care	care is focused on providing relief from the symptoms and stress of illness with the
	goal to improve quality of life for both the patient and family. Effective palliative
	care is delivered by a trained team of doctors, nurses, social workers, chaplains, and
	other health professionals who collaborate to provide an extra layer of support.
	Based on the needs of the patient, not on prognosis, palliative care is appropriate at
	any age and any stage of serious illness and may be provided alongside curative treatments in primary and specialty settings.
	For continuity across the state, LifeCircle will also adopt this as a working definition
	of Palliative Care, understanding that part of the definition is better defined as a
	description of what palliative care does. This definition was proposed and adopted
	by the 3 state palliative care grants using the CAPC definition from which it was
	built.
