In 2023, complaints to BBB® about phishing scams nearly doubled – a record high. With the current year's reports trending up, phishing is clearly on the rise.

Phishing attempts come in a variety of forms

- Email Maliciour
- Malicious links or documents attached
- Pretends to be from a well-known company
- Can come from compromised trusted addresses



Text Messages

- Attempts to get you to click on a link
- · Preys on people's inherent trust of texts over email
- Fake delivery issue scams often use this method



Voicemails/Calls

- Threatening language to get you to call or stay on line
- Scam numbers on search engines
- Law enforcement or government imposter scams



Malware

- Used to initiate tech support or ransomware scams
- Locks computer and requires you to call a number
- Claims to have recorded webcam videos/photos

Phishing Scam Red Flags

- Claims suspicious activity or fraudulent logins
- Describes unexpected
 problems with an account
- Tries to confirm financial information
- Requests to click a link to make a payment
- Pairs generic message with a logo of a well-known company
- Uses typo-filled and urgent language

How can businesses protect themselves?

- Verify unknown emailed invoices before paying
- Confirm emails from what appears to be trusted sources, before giving information
- Implement multi-factor authentication for all payment processes to vendors
- Train employees on how to spot and avoid phishing scams
- Create best practices policies
