


TRANSITIONS OF CARE REPORT October 2024



THROUGHPUT SURVEY REPORT OCTOBER 2024

The South Dakota Association of Healthcare Organizations (SDAHO) has been hearing from members about the challenges they face in placing patients in post-acute care beds across the state. SDAHO staff have worked with peers in other states, primarily Nebraska and Minnesota, to develop a survey to collect data measuring the impact this is having across South Dakota. A total of 19 hospitals participated in the October survey, with 4 stating they had at least one patient who had been ready to discharge for seven days or longer but was still awaiting discharge. Delays in placing patients impact both the patients and the provider community, creating financial hardships and impacting quality of life. The goal of producing this survey is to help show policy makers, government leaders, and the public the impact this is having on hospitals, post-acute care providers, and patients across South Dakota. 
In addition to the patients awaiting discharge for 7 days or longer, at the time of the survey SD hospitals reported 4 patients in the Emergency Department awaiting an inpatient bed and 87 patients awaiting bed acceptance to a tertiary care center.

Patients Awaiting Discharge to Post-Acute Setting > 7 Days by Facility Type




Notable Comments on October 2024 Survey

Sex offender patients cause extra difficulties to place.

Behavioral health needs make it hard to find facilities to place patients. One of the biggest causes of discharge delays generally is patients who have been accepted to a post acute facility, generally SNF or Swingbed, who are waiting 3-5 days for insurance authorization. These delays cause throughput challenges, more people to be held in surgical areas for longer times, more people held in the emergency room, and transfers from outlying facilities being delayed.

Patients Awaiting Discharge Requiring Specialized Care




On average it costs a hospital \$1,000 per day to care for these patients. The estimated impact at the time of the survey was \$1.70M.
